

Jacques LAMBERT's Biography

Jacques LAMBERT has been the Executive Director of the French Football Federation (FFF) since 2005 and led a two-faceted professional career.

After completing a curriculum in Political Sciences in Grenoble and in the National School of Administration, he was for 17 years a high-ranking member of the state administration, notably among the prefectural body, the government General Secretariat and the cabinet of two French Prime Ministers.

During his office as Prefect of Savoie, he was in charge of coordinating the intervention of State services in the preparation of the 1992 winter Olympic Games in Albertville, more specifically by conceiving and directing the whole security system.

In the second phase of his professional life, Jacques Lambert reoriented his career to sport in the private sector. In 1993, he took up the direction of the organizing committee of the 1998 Football World Cup.

He then joined the Suez Group for 5 years as trade action manager and Managing Director of Suez Industrial Solutions, a subsidiary company dedicated to great industrial projects of the Suez Group.

In April 2005, Jacques Lambert took up the management of the first Sport Federation in France.
